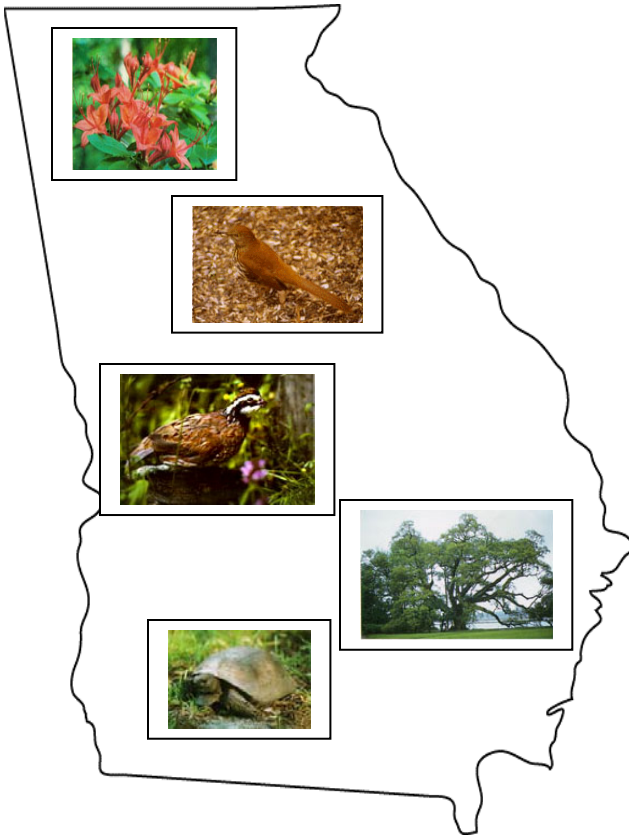

Overview – The Georgia Master Naturalist Program is a series of weekly (8 consecutive weeks) programs with specific environmental topics. The program is a combination of lectures and outside hands-on learning. Total program time is 48 hours of instruction.

Topics – Topics include: Introduction to Naturalist Program, Ecology, Forestry, Wildlife, Water, Human Impact, Geology, Tree ID, Animal ID, and Agriculture. The topics are designed to teach participants about natural resource management, use, and conservation. We emphasize human use of natural resources through sound management.

Cost – Cost is approximately \$150.00 for the course and includes learning material, shirt, nametag, certificate, refreshments. Students are responsible for their own transportation and lunch.
